Microeconomics impact of COVID19 on Moroccan economy

Abstract :

The spread of the Covid-19 virus not only has health consequences, it also has a tragic impact on many economic activities, in Morocco and around the world. To this end, we must not kid ourselves, but we must foresee heavy economic losses in several sectors of activity.

After the outbreak of the coronavirus epidemic, the first impacts on the world economy are starting to be felt. In Morocco, economic growth according to the HCP (the High Commission for Plans) would have slowed to + 1.1% and would stand at -1.8% respectively, in the first and second quarters of 2020, instead of +1.9 % and + 2.1% in the absence of the COVID effect.

The objective of this work is to analyze the microeconomic impact of the COVID crisis on the economy of Morocco.
